## Journeying in Faith and Prayer

Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." John 6:11–12

The people who were present for this miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fish had to journey to be there. First, they followed Jesus to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, and then they followed Him up a mountain in a remote area. This is significant because it tells us that a miracle of such magnitude could only take place for those who had faith and acted on that faith. Jesus could have easily performed this miracle in the Temple in Jerusalem or in a synagogue where people doubted Him. If He did that, then many of His skeptics and critics would have seen His almighty power with their own eyes. Jesus could have also done this miracle in Nazareth, His hometown, in the presence of His extended family and friends. Perhaps if He had done this, then they would have come to believe in Him. But Jesus didn't do this incredible miracle in places where faith was lacking. Instead, He went to a remote area where only those who truly wanted to be with Him were present.

Note that the actions by which Jesus performed this miracle are similar to the way He instituted the Holy Eucharist during the Last Supper. We read above that Jesus "took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them..." Though this miracle is recorded in all four Gospels, in John's Gospel it is a prelude to Jesus' Bread of Life Discourse in which Jesus teaches, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Therefore, this miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish should be seen as a teaching about the Eucharist. It is in the Eucharist that Jesus feeds us to superabundance. The Eucharist is the gift of His very life and the food that will bring us to eternal life.

Unfortunately, it seems that very few people ever discover the gift of the Eucharist. Many people look at their participation in Mass as a duty that they must fulfill rather than as an invitation to share in the superabundant life. The only way we will discover the superabundant life given to us through the Eucharist is by working to imitate the faith of the people whom Jesus fed on that mountain. Again, the people who received this miracle had to journey either around or across the sea and climb a mountain. So also with us, the only way to come to a fruitful participation in the Eucharist is to make a concerted effort. The journey we make is one of faith, and the mountain we climb is one of prayer. Unless we believe deeply in our Lord, believe in the superabundant and transforming power of the Eucharist, seek it out faithfully every week and do so prayerfully, we will never be fed in this superabundant way.

Reflect, today, upon the symbolism of Jesus traveling to this remote area so as to perform this most incredible miracle. See this journey that you are invited to take as a journey toward the discovery of the superabundant grace bestowed upon you through the Most Holy Eucharist. The only way that you will receive this grace is by committing yourself to the journey of faith and prayer. Don't miss out. Don't ignore the incredible value of this Gift. Seek out our Lord and discover His Gift of superabundant grace within your fruitful participation in the Holy Mass.

My Eucharistic Lord, You call me to journey up the mountain of faith in the most Holy Eucharist through prayer and determination. May I more deeply discover the great value of the Holy Mass and seek to be fed by You in this superabundant way. Jesus, I trust in You.



# SACRED HEART CATHOLIC PARISH HINDMARSH – FINDON CATHOLIC TEACHING AND ACTION IN OUR PARISH SCHOOLS

At our Parish Pastoral Council meetings our 5 Parish Schools provide an overview of happenings within their communities. Following a recent meeting it was decided to share a little of these activities and learnings with our wider parish communities. There are some amazing student and staff focuses on Catholic teaching and action taking place!

#### Immaculate Heart of Mary School

Each year we focus on one of our 5 school pillars: Love, Hope, Connectedness, Inclusivity and Justice. This year is our **Year of Inclusivity**. The scripture passage <u>'Be kind and compassionate to one another'</u> (Ephesians 4:32) is visible in our school environment and in all our educational practices and interactions. Classes explore what this sounds like, feels like and looks like.

Positive Behavioural Interventions and Support (PBIS): Several staff are attending professional



learning in 2024 on implementing positive and proactive wellbeing practices centred on respectful relationships. This new learning will support us to continue building positive connections through our Religious Education, Heart Spirituality focus, scripture, five school pillars, Catholic Social Teachings and Health and PE.

Our National Reconciliation Week - Prayer Focus

#### **Nazareth Catholic Community**

Many opportunities for ongoing professional learning in the area of Religious Education are available for staff. One of these is the **Café Theology Program**. This year's focus is on *Interfaith and Ecumenical Dialogue*. A recent session focussed on <u>Jewish-Christian Dialogue</u>, presented by Rachel Gillespie, Director of The Abraham Institute. All staff are invited to participate in the Café Theology Program throughout the year and parishioners are also welcome.

We were excited to invite APRIMs, teachers of Years 7 -10 Religious Education and Leaders of Learning to participate in a 1-day professional learning workshop exploring CESA's Award-Winning Limitless Possibilities model of social entrepreneurial learning and how it can enhance student engagement in Religious Education. Aiming to empower student agency through social justice action, this professional learning supports teachers to integrate social entrepreneurial capabilities and thinking into RE curriculum design.

For our Mother's Day afternoon tea, a group of past and present mothers joined us. Our Senior Work Experience Group planned, made food and welcomed our guests. The room was set up with beautiful displays made by students from across the school. We had an amazing spread of delicious food.

#### **Catholic Special Schools**

Catholic Special Schools is a newly formed entity within Catholic Education in Adelaide, comprising our two existing R-12 sites, Our Lady of La Vang and St Patrick's (Dulwich), with a third site planned. In Term 2, the new principal of Catholic Special Schools was announced: Shannon Correll will take up this role.

#### A Time for Giving

The Senior East class recently visited the Women's and Children's Hospital to drop in donated gifts for the children staying at the hospital. The idea was inspired by Nicholas' wish to thank the Hospital for looking after him so well during Term 1.



#### **Reconciliation Week**

In June we celebrated Reconciliation Week with a liturgy and assembly and then gathered as a whole school to make the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags for a drone flyer over. See this wonderful event on our school Facebook page.

#### **Mini Vinnies**

Recently Sandra, our Minnie Vinnies representative, joined our Minnie Vinnies meeting. She presented each child with a prayer book and Ava led us in prayer to start our meeting. Sandra then presented each child with a beanie and told the children to wear their beanies with pride as leaders advocating for those in need. Then, the moment that everyone was waiting for, the presentation of the badges. The children eagerly put their badges on as a symbol of their leadership. Sandra also helped us change our language "for the poor" to "people who are disadvantaged at this time". Sandra explained that sometimes people need help for a short time depending on their circumstances such as losing their job.

#### St Michael's College

#### Long Walk

12 Indigenous students attended the Long Walk football match (Richmond v Essendon) with their families. The trip provided the students with valuable insights into the importance of the Long Walk and the broader goals of Reconciliation in Australia.

#### Outreach

Our annual Mission Action Fundraiser was held again in Term 1 raising money for the Lasallian Foundation which focuses on providing an education for students in Pakistan and Papua New Guinea. In addition, following our Primary Campus Project Compassion fundraising over Lent, we were able to donate \$2867.45 to Caritas Australia.

#### Old Scholar 70 year reunion

This year we celebrate 70 Years of St Michael's College. A group of some original students and students who were part of the early years came together on May 31<sup>st</sup> at the Primary Campus. It is those students who lead the way forward, leaving behind a legacy that defines St Michael's College today. The Junior Primary Choir performed and our visitors experienced a student led tour of the school today.
