The Culmination of Life of Faith

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." Luke 2:29–32

At the time of Jesus' birth, there was a man named Simeon who had spent his whole life preparing for one significant moment. Like all faithful Jews at the time, Simeon was waiting for the coming Messiah. The Holy Spirit had revealed to him that he would indeed see the Messiah before his death—and so this happened when Mary and Joseph brought Jesus into the Temple to offer Him to the Lord as an infant.

Try to imagine the scene. Simeon had lived a holy and devout life. And deep within his conscience, he knew that his life on earth would not come to an end until he was privileged to see the Savior of the World with his own eyes. He knew this by a special gift of faith, an interior revelation of the Holy Spirit, and he believed.

It's helpful to think about this unique gift of knowledge that Simeon had throughout his life. Normally we gain knowledge through our five senses. We see something, hear something, taste, smell, or feel something, and as a result come to know it to be true. Physical knowledge is very reliable and is the normal way we come to know things. But this gift of knowledge Simeon had was different. It was deeper and was spiritual in nature. He knew he would see the Messiah before he died, not because of some external sensory perception he had received but because of an interior revelation from the Holy Spirit.

This truth begs the question, which type of knowledge is more certain? Something you see with your eyes, touch, smell, hear or taste? Or something that God speaks to you in the depths of your soul by a revelation of grace? Though these types of knowledge are different, it's important to understand that the spiritual knowledge that is given by the Holy Spirit is far more certain than anything perceived through the five senses alone. This spiritual knowledge has the power to change your life and direct all your actions toward that revelation.

For Simeon, this interior knowledge of a spiritual nature suddenly united with his five senses when Jesus was brought into the Temple. Simeon suddenly saw, heard and felt this Child Whom he knew he would one day see with his own eyes and touch with his own hands. For Simeon, that moment was the culminating moment of his life.

Reflect, today, upon anything that our Lord has spoken to you in the depths of your soul. Too often we ignore His gentle voice as it speaks, preferring instead to live only in the sensory world. But the spiritual reality within us must become the center and foundation of our lives. It is there where God speaks, and it is there where we, too, will discover the central purpose and meaning of our lives.

My spiritual Lord, I thank You for the countless ways in which You speak to me day and night in the depths of my own soul. Help me to be always attentive to You and to Your gentle voice as You speak to me. May Your voice and Your voice alone become the guiding direction of my life. May I trust in Your Word and never waver from the mission You have given to me. Jesus, I trust in You.




## **Our Lady of Lourdes** Saturday, 8th February at 10am **St Francis Xavier's Cathedral**

#### World Day for Consecrated Life

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, is also the World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life. It is important for us to celebrate the lives of all the consecrated religious sisters and brothers in our Archdiocese and to pray in thanksgiving to God for them.

#### Presentation of Jesus

The Presentation of Jesus is an early episode in the life of Jesus Christ, describing his presentation at the Temple in Jerusalem. It is celebrated by many churches 40 days after Christmas on Candlemas, or the "Feast of the Presentation of Jesus". The episode is described in chapter 2 of the Gospel of Luke in the New Testament. Within the account, "Luke's narration of the Presentation in the Temple combines the purification rite with the Jewish ceremony of the redemption of the firstborn (Luke 2, Luke 2:23-24).

In the Eastern and Western liturgical calendars the presentation of the Lord falls on 2 February, forty days (inclusive) after Christmas. In the Church of England it may be celebrated on this day, or on the Sunday between 28 January and 3 February. This feast never falls in Lent; the earliest that Ash Wednesday can fall is 4 February, for the

case of Easter on 22 March in a non-leap year.

However, in the Tridentine rite, it can fall in the pre-Lenten season if Easter is early enough, and "Alleluia" has to be omitted from this feast's liturgy when that happens.

### Celebrating the Consecrated life a special edition - CONGREGATION OF HOLY CROSS

United by our motto – Ave Crux, Spes Unica (Hail the Cross, our Only Hope)



The emblem of the Congregation of Holy Cross is a golden Latin cross with two silver anchors, set against a blue background. The motto of the Congregation is Spes Unica, which translates to "Our Only Hope" in English.



Founder:

**Blessed Basil Moreau**, founder of the Congregation of Holy Cross, was born in France in 1799. A sought-after preacher and lively professor, Fr. Moreau formed the first association of Holy Cross in 1837 to serve the educational needs of post-revolution France. He intended that this Congregation, composed at its origins of three distinct Societies, namely, Sisters, Priests, and Brothers, be an apostolic institute.

The initials, "C.S.C.", after their names are an abbreviation for the Latin "Congregatio a Sancta Cruce", which means "Congregation of Holy Cross". The Congregation of Holy Cross was founded in 1837 by Blessed Father Basil Moreau, who was a priest of the Diocese of Le Mans, France.

We are a global community of pontifical right: priests and brothers who wish to abandon all to follow Christ. United by our motto - Ave Crux, Spes Unica (Hail the Cross, our Only Hope) - we are sent forth to make God known, loved, and served in ministries of education, parish, and mission throughout the world.

#### **Current Superior General**

The General Administration for the Congregation of Holy Cross is located in Rome, Italy, and also the place of residence of the Superior General and his Council. The Superior General is Br. Paul Bednarczyk, C.S.C.

**Moreau** believed that the <u>work that God had entrusted to Holy Cross</u> extended beyond the borders of France to the rest of the world. Within a few short years of founding Holy Cross, Moreau sent his priests, brothers, and sisters from France to Algeria (1840), the <u>United States</u>(1841), <u>Canada</u> (1847), <u>Italy</u> (1850), and East Bengal, or present day <u>India</u> and <u>Bangladesh</u> (1852).

In 1903, all religious orders in France were suppressed, and North America became the focus of Holy Cross's subsequent expansion. Numerous educational institutions, parishes, and other ministries were founded in the United States and Canada during these decades.

#### The Expansion of CSC

Beginning again in the 1943, Holy Cross expanded its work around the world, establishing missions in Chile (1943) <u>Brazil</u> (1943), <u>Haiti</u> (1944), <u>Ghana</u> (1957), <u>Uganda</u>(1958), <u>Peru</u> (1963), <u>Kenya</u> (1978), <u>Mexico</u> (1987), and <u>Tanzania</u> (1999). With the most recent establishment of a religious presence in the <u>Philippines</u> (2008) and in Adelaide, Australia (2019), Holy Cross today serves in <u>17 different countries</u> on five continents.

#### Ministries: Education, Parish, Missionary Outreach & Social Justice

As educators in the faith, seeking to educate both minds and hearts, the Congregation of Holy Cross sponsors and ministries in a variety of institutions from parish schools to <u>secondary and middle schools</u>, from <u>vocational and trade schools</u> to <u>colleges and universities</u>. Many of them are recognized as leading and pioneering institutions in their respective countries.

**Countries we currently Serve in:** Australia, Brazil, Bangladesh, Canada, Chille, France, Ghana, Haiti, India, Italy, Kenya, Mexico, Papua New Guinea, Peru, Philippines, Tanzania, Uganda, United States.

Currently only 4 Holy Cross Priests serve in Australia in the Archdiocese of Adelaide Fr. Lancy D'Silva, CSC and Fr. Santhosh Nazareth, CSC. Fr. Sijo Joseph, CSC & Fr. Sahaya Renjith, CSC render their services in Port Pirie Diocese

#### **Popular Saint of CSC**

Brother Andre's heart is displayed in a vault! - Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal, Montreal, Quebec, Canada.



André Bessette, C.S.C., commonly known as Brother André and since his canonization as Saint André of Montreal, was a lay brother of the Congregation of Holy Cross and a significant figure of the Catholic Church among French-Canadians. He was canonised on the same day Mary Mackillop of the cross was canonised 17, October 2010.

FAMILY MINISTRIES

The United States is also home the headquarters of <u>Holy Cross Family Ministries</u>, which was founded by <u>Servant of God, Fr. Patrick</u> <u>Peyton, C.S.C</u> to promote family prayer, especially with the Rosary. HCFM includes <u>Family Theater Productions</u> in Hollywood. It carries its founder's message that "a family that prays together, stays together" across the world, including all 16 countries in which the Congregation serves.


